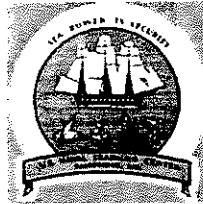

FISHER HOUSE EXPANSION:

Bracing for a generation of war veterans needing long-term medical care, the Fisher House Foundation plans to build two dozen homes near military and Veterans Affairs hospitals in the U.S. by 2011. The non-profit foundation plans to boost its network of 38 homes to 62. It is expected that an influx of veterans from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan with such ailments as traumatic brain injury and post-traumatic stress disorder will require special care. The foundation, created in 1990 builds homes near military or VA medical facilities for families of patients needing a place to stay while their loved ones receive the medical care needed. Donations allow families to stay at the homes for free. It is important that the young men and women have their families with them for support while undergoing rehabilitation. The Foundation plans to finish building five homes by the end of this year. Four of these homes are near VA hospitals and clinics. "Our future is really with the VA Clinics, the long-term signature wound of this war is the traumatic brain injury and that has a long-term period of rehabilitation which will be done by the VA. Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, the largest military hospital outside the U.S. has two Fisher houses that offer 19 rooms. The hospital serves war wounded and patients stationed at bases across Europe.

NEWS YOU CAN USE...

Veteran's Pensions:

If you are a wartime veteran with a limited income and you are no longer able to work, you may qualify for a Veterans Disability Pension or the Veterans Pension for Veterans 65 or older. Many veterans of wartime service are completely unaware of the fact that if they are 65 or older and on a limited income they may qualify for a VA

Pension without be disabled. An estimated 2 million impoverished veterans and their widows are not receiving the VA pension they deserve because they do not know about it. The VA has had limited success in getting the information to them. You may be eligible if you were discharged from service under other than dishonorable conditions, and you served 90 days or more of active duty with at least 1 day during a period of war time. With the advent of the Gulf War on 2 Aug 90 (AND still not ended by Congress to this day), veterans can now serve after 2 Aug 90 during a period of war time. When they do, they generally now must serve 24 months to be eligible for pension or any other benefit provided they meet the exclusions of 38CFR 3.12(d). Which require you are permanently and totally disabled, or are age 65 or older, AND your countable family income is below a yearly limit set by law. Family Annual Income Limits effective 1 DEC 2007 cannot exceed the following:

- Vet with no dependents \$11,181
- Vet with spouse or child \$14,643
- Vet married to a Vet \$14,643
- Vet with additional Children \$add \$1,909 to the limit for each child
- Housebound Vet with no dependents \$13,664
- Housebound Vet with one dependent \$17,126
- Vet who needs aid and attendance with no dependents \$18,654
- Vet who needs aid and attendance with one dependent \$22,113

Note some income is not counted toward the yearly limit, i.e., welfare benefits, some wages earned by dependent children, and Supplemental Security Income. It's also important to note that your medical related expenses are considered when determining your yearly family income. VA pays you the difference between your countable family income and the yearly income limit which describes your situation. This difference is generally paid in 12 equal monthly payments rounded down to the nearest dollar. You can apply by filling out VA Form 21-526, Veteran's Application for Compensation or Pension. Social Security Debit Card:

For millions of Americans, accessing their Social Security benefits is now just a card swipe away. A new debit card being offered by the Treasury Department gives nearly 4 million recipients who have no bank accounts an alternative to paper checks that they must cash, usually at a price. The new debit card, issued by Comerica Bank, was quietly marketed to nearly 3.5 million recipients of Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) this spring. It's now available to any benefit recipient through enrollment at www.usdirectexpress.com. States already load child support payments and unemployment benefits onto debit cards. The federal government has used prepaid debit cards, too, for disaster relief aid. But the Social Security debit card is the largest push to date to switch from costly paper checks to electronic payments. "Our goal is to move to 100% electronic payments, it's safer and more reliable for delivery of funds."

The new debit card will eliminate the need for consumers without bank accounts to use costly check-cashing services. It will also save the government money. The Treasury estimates that if all 4 million recipients without bank accounts signed up for the card, it would save \$42 million a year. As with any other debit card, using it won't always be free. For instance, holders will get one free ATM withdrawal per month. After that, they'll be charged 90 cents for each additional monthly withdrawal. A fee of 75 cents per month also applies if card holders want paper statements mailed to them. Still, the fees are among the lowest in the industry for such services. About 80% of the 57.3 million Social Security and SSI recipients have their benefits directly deposited into their bank accounts. The challenge will be to get the remaining consumers to switch from checks to electronic payments such as direct deposit or the new debit card. The card might be confusing if they're not savvy about electronic payments and don't have experience with using a bank account.



Car Rental Tips

With the upcoming Reunion we thought this information would be useful to those planning to rent a car.

Many travelers operate under the misconception that car rental rates are all about the same, and that shopping is a waste of time. But rates do vary – sometimes by quite a bit – between companies and destinations. Car rental companies reward people who make life easy for them and penalize those who don't know the ropes. Here are five tips, in no particular order, for lowering your car rental expenses:

- Beware of hidden fees and extras. If the rental company has to top-off the gas tank after your return, you will pay a ridiculous price per gallon. Always ask that the car be filled up prior to your departure, and then bring it back full of gas. There are plenty of other additional charges that can take a nice rate to an ordinary deal very quickly. A weekly rate of \$125 showed up recently for a compact rental out of San Antonio International Airport. That's about \$18/day. Not bad. Go to the reservation page of your agreement, and you learn that taxes and fees add more than \$50. There's 10% sales tax, something called a vehicle license fee of nearly \$19 and an "arena fee" of \$7.19. Keep that in mind when you see rates under \$20/day advertised.
- Airport rentals are best avoided. In that previous example, there was also an \$11.51 "airport fee." It's often very convenient to rent a car at the airport, but keep in mind that you'll pay for the privilege. Many times you can rent a car from your hotel. If you can conveniently arrange a hotel shuttle or public transportation from airport to front desk chances are good you'll save money taking delivery off the airport grounds.
- Decline insurance. Most travelers know this one, but there is a lot of pressure to change minds at the rental counter. Companies make big profits from insurance fees. Some clerks are trained to create as much anxiety as

possible for people who decline it. The odds are slim that you'll need any of this coverage. It is very likely that your auto insurance policy at home covers rentals as well. Call your agent to verify it. Also check with your credit card company to see if using the card to pay for a rental provides collision coverage. In many cases, you'll find a positive response.

- Reserve the smallest car possible. Most North Americans who rent cars in the U.S. don't like driving compacts. Rental companies know this, and they usually order more mid-size and full-size cars. If your destination is a smaller facility or non-hub airport, chances are good that they have only a few compacts. On some days, they might not have any compacts when customers arrive. In that situation, if you've reserved a compact, they are obligated to give you a free upgrade. Many times, you'll move up to categories for no additional charge. Remember, you can usually pay an upgrade fee on the spot for a larger car if they call your bluff and tell you the compact is ready to go. There will be times when the smallest cars are all that remains on the lot. Those times are fairly rare.
- Shop for quirky deals and special offers. A recent search on Hertz.com showed a three-day rental of a mid-sized car from Denver International would cost \$236USD, nearly \$79/day. If four more days were added, the total cost goes up, but only to \$361. That's less than \$52/day. This is possible because on day five, Hertz's weekly rate took effect. Many times, reserving a car for a week (even if it sits in the driveway or parking lot) is cheaper than trying to get a daily rate on a shorter rental period. It might be smarter to pick up the car on Thursday, even if you don't really need it until Friday. The Friday rental might come with a weekend rate that is more expensive. There are times when a car rental bid on Priceline (www.priceline.com) will save you money, but unlike hotels, there are frequent instances where the bid prices are very similar (or even higher) than the standard rates listed on company web sites. Speaking of company web sites, some of the best rental rates originate in their special offers pages.

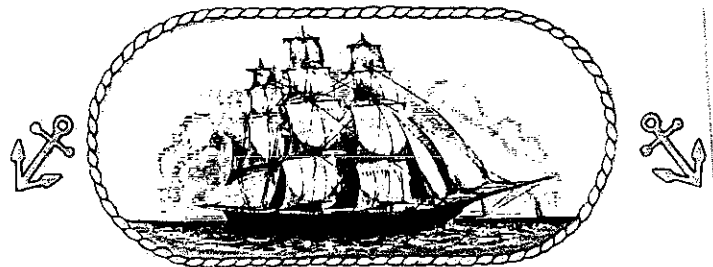
Trivia...

Knot:

The term "knot," or nautical mile, is used worldwide to denote one's speed through water. Today, knots are measured with electronic devices, but in the 18th century, such devices were unknown. Ingenious mariners developed the log line, a reliable device for measuring speed. From this method we got the term knot.

The log line was a length of twine marked at 47.33-foot intervals by colored knots. At one end a long chip was fastened. Shaped like the sector of a circle, the chip was weighted at the rounded end with lead.

When thrown over the stern, it would float pointing upward and would remain relatively stationary. The log line was allowed to run over the side for 28 seconds and then hauled on board. There was a count of the knots that had passed over the side. In this way, the ship's speed was measured.



Log Book:

Today, any bound record kept on a daily basis aboard ship is called a "log." Originally, records were kept on sailing ships by inscribing information on shingles cut from logs and hinged so they opened like books. When paper became more readily available, "log books" were manufactured from paper and bound. Shingles were relegated to naval museums, but the slang term stuck.

Obituary received regarding one of our shipmates:

Albert Francis Bagley Jr. of Havre de Grace, died April 30 at his home. He was 82.

Born in Towson, MD he was the son of the late Albert F. Bagley Sr. and Myrtle Frye Bagley.

He was a veteran of World War II, joining the Navy in January 1943. He trained at Bainbridge Naval Training Center and saw action on D-Day. He was honorably discharged in 1946. He rejoined the Navy in 1950 and served in the Korean War. He was again honorably discharged in 1954. Before his discharge, he was the recipient of the European Theatre ribbon, the Pacific Theatre Ribbon, the American Theatre ribbon, the Good Conduct Ribbon and the Victory medal.

Al served as a past commander of American Legion Joseph L. Davis Post 47 of Havre de Grace and was a member of Masonic Lodge 130, Tall Cedars Lodge 142 and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary.

Accomplished in many areas, he worked in the automobile business, as a professional

photographer, as a charter boat captain, as a private pilot and as a member of the civil Air Patrol. His family said he was an avid gardener and a creator of miniature soldiers and collected model trains. He most enjoyed spending time with his wife, Helen C. Wood-Bagley, and family, close friends and his dog, Lilly.

The Clarion Aberdeen Hotel is our reunion site and is located just off Interstate 95 at Exit 85, Maryland route 22, east, left at Beards Hill Road and left onto Hospitality Way.



This is an outstanding property where you will certainly enjoy your stay. The hotel offers spacious and well-appointed rooms with all the guest amenities to make your stay comfortable. Each room has refrigerators, microwaves, irons and ironing boards, hair dryers and coffee makers, 2-line phones with voicemail. Cable TV with HBO; pay-per-view movies and Nintendo are additional comforts. There is also a fitness center and a seasonal outdoor pool.

Rooms are offered in King or 2 Double beds at the special rate of \$89.00 per night with breakfast buffet. Fully handicap rooms are available and, if needed, please request these needs when you reserve your room. The Aberdeen Clarion has graciously allowed us an extended period for our special room rate of \$89.00 per night from 23 September through 8 October 2008. The restaurant, Durango's Southwestern Grille serves breakfast, lunch and dinner and nightly entertainment is offered at the Diamond Club. There is also room service available during the week from 0600 to 2100 and on Sunday from 0700 to 2200.

Hotel Reservations: Reunion attendees must make their hotel reservations directly with the hotel's registration office by calling the listed number in the left column heading. Specify that your reservation is for USNTC Bainbridge Association to receive our special room rate of \$89.00 per night.

Reserve your Room Now !!! Your reservation will require a deposit equaling one night's room charge or a valid credit card number. Charges will be applied to your card only at the time you check in or you fail to check in and fail to cancel your reservation on time.
